A farewell to Mrs. Carter (Rainbow Room Teacher) who is leaving Colebourne today.



Please remember to label your child's clothes with their name as this helps us reunite items with their owners.




Summer heat

Reception Offer Day - 16 April 2025

Information from the Local Authority:

If you applied online, on time and provided an email address, we will email you on Wednesday 16 April 2025 to tell you which primary school your child has been offered.

We cannot guarantee the exact time you will receive your email as this depends on your service provider. However, we expect you to receive your offer email by 4pm on Wednesday 16 April 2025.

We will also send you a formal offer letter posted by 1st class post on Wednesday 16 April 2025, which you will receive from 16 April.

The offer letter will explain how to accept or refuse the offer that has been made.

Do not contact Birmingham City Council before you have received the offer of a school place.

The school admissions team cannot tell you which primary school place has been offered to your child by phone or email.

You must have received your email or letter before contacting the school admissions team.

You may contact School Admissions if you have not received your email or letter by Thursday 17 April 2025.

We will be in contact with families who have been offered a place at Colebourne after the Easter break and let you know all about the welcome meetings and transition.


Children need to be collected promptly at 4.15pm from outside Year 2. Please use the pedestrian entrance only - not the car park.

Colebourne Science Fair

We are excited to announce a return to Colebourne's Science Fair. The children are **all** invited to participate by investigating and recording their own science project, either by themselves or with a family member.

The project can be;

- an experiment to answer a question,
- a problem and solution
- a research project.

It can be on any area of science that interests your child.

Questions could be something like;

- 'What mixture makes the biggest bubbles?'
- 'Which is the best make of bubble gum?'
- 'Which tastes best: supermarket 'home brand' biscuits/cereals or branded ones?
- 'What colour bird feeder do birds prefer?'

How to enter


When your child has carried out their investigation or research, they need to make a display board to communicate their learning to others. This needs to have 3 panels of information (as shown) which can be made from a large cardboard box or even a cereal box, opened out, painted or covered in wrapping paper and held together with tape.

The display board should follow the format we use for Science Investigations in school and clearly show;

the project title

- the question or problem
- what your child thinks the answer is (prediction/hypothesis)
- what they did (method/procedure)
- what they observed/what happened (results).
- what they found out (conclusion)

Here is an example of what a board could look like:



They can also include a small model or experiment and/or project notes.

The children need to bring their completed projects to school on the morning of **Thursday 1st May.**

All children's entries will be displayed in their classrooms and shared with their class and year group. If you wish to come and see the entries for yourself, they will be on display in the Hall from 3.00pm on **Thursday 1st May 2025.**

We can't wait to see all the exciting ideas the children come up with this year!

We have been able to maintain the same charges for breakfast club, after school club and snacks for the Summer Term.

District Football Nominations 2025/26

Dear Parent / Guardian,

Your son/daughter has been identified by their school as a talented footballer and nominated for the 2025/26 Erdington and Saltley district football trials. This letter contains key information about district football.

What is district football?

District football is the highest level of youth football for primary aged pupils outside of academy football. As a city, Birmingham has over 300 primary schools. These schools are divided into seven geographical districts, with each district having its own representative football team. What is Erdington and Saltley district?

Erdington and Saltley have 49 primary schools across Erdington, Saltley, Nechells, Hodge Hill, Washwood Heath, Bromford and Shard End.

My child already plays for a football team. Is this a problem?

No. District footballers also play for a second team - either a grassroots team or an academy team. Boys' district matches are played on Saturday mornings, while girls' games are played on Friday evenings. They do not clash with grassroots football.

My child plays for a professional academy. Is this a problem?

No. Children who play for academy teams (e.g. Birmingham City, Walsall, Wolves) are allowed to play district football.

Why should my child play district football?

Best facilities in the city: All district games are played from a central location - Aston Villa's training ground.

High standard: District football is the highest standard of youth football outside of academy football.

Player Pathway: District football offers players a direct route into an academy such as Aston Villa, Birmingham City or Wolves. Each year, many Erdington and Saltley players are signed by professional clubs. We currently have former players playing professionally for Manchester City, Manchester United, Leeds United, Aston Villa, Birmingham City, West Bromwich Albion and others.


