Please note – this message can be left in **home language** if needed as our system can automatically translate.


Please aim to leave absence messaged by 8.40am on the first day of absence.

# School Policy Reminders

# Nuts:

Children should not bring any items containing nuts into school.

# **Birthday Treats:**

We ask that **birthday treats** are **not bought into school**; this includes food items and gift bags.

# Jewellery:

The **only jewellery** allowed in schools is **studded earings** and watches (No devices with any recording function); All jewellery **MUST be removed for PE and swimming**; we suggest jewellery is left at home on PE and Swimming days.

# Year 5 and Year 6 Walk home consent:

Children in Year 5 and Year 6 may be dismissed from school witout an adult collecting them, with parental consent.

Children in the new year 6 who had consent in year 5 will be assumed to continue with this into Year 6, unless parents contact us.

Parents of children entering Year 5 will receive and message with a link to a form to complete if they wish to give their consent for their child to walk home without an adult.

Please note – this consent includes all times where the school day finishes such as Friday afternoons, any half day finishes and any early finishes for any events.

# MATHS SUMMER ACTIVITES

Here are a few easy maths related activities you can do over the summer that are fun and engaging.

# EYFS (Early Years Foundation Stage)

- Shape Hunt Safari Find and name 2D shapes around the house or garden.
- Number Picnic Set up a teddy bear picnic and count out items (cups, plates, snacks) for each toy.
- Water Play with Measuring Cups Explore full/empty/half using jugs and containers in the bath or garden.

### <u>key Stage 1 (Years 1-2):</u>

- Lego Maths Use bricks for counting, adding, subtracting, and grouping.
- Tally Chart Treasure Hunt Find and record items in nature (leaves, stones, flowers) using tally marks.
- Toy Shop Role Play Use coins to "buy" toys or snacks, practise adding and giving change.

### Key Stage 2 (Years 3-6):

- Maths Bake-Off Follow recipes using scales, convert weights and cut portions into fractions.
- Times Table Bingo Make bingo cards using multiples of chosen times tables. Play with the family!
- Maths Map Challenge Draw a treasure map and use coordinates, angles, and directions to guide a search.

### <u>Pharmacy First – an NHS service being offered from pharmacies</u> <u>across England for children and adults</u>

Birmingham and Solihull Integrated Care System Caring about healthier lives Birmingham and Solihull

Did you know about an NHS service which pharmacies across England are offering for children (as well as adults) called **Pharmacy First**?



### What is Pharmacy First?

Community Pharmacists offer free and confidential advice for minor illnesses such as coughs, colds, and eye infection. If appropriate, they can also provide treatment\* without a prescription for seven common conditions:

- Urinary tract infection (women aged 16-64)
- Sinusitis (adults and children aged 12+)
- Sore throat (adults and children aged 5+)
- Earache (children and young adults aged 1-17)
- Infected insect bite (adults and children aged 1+)
- Impetigo (adults and children aged 1+)
- Shingles (adults aged 18+)

The pharmacy will send an electronic message to the person's GP surgery so their health record can be updated. Should the pharmacist be unable to help, they will direct the person to their GP surgery or other health professional as appropriate.

This service takes away the potential delay of having to wait for a GP appointment and may help ensure children get well and back to school as quickly as possible, as well as supporting parents/carers to also get better sooner if they are unwell.

Patients that are already exempt from prescription charges, such as children, will still be exempt from charges if treatment is provided for the listed conditions, otherwise usual <u>NHS prescription charge rules</u> apply.
