It has been a very busy week in reception.

In Theme the children went for an Autumn walk to look for signs of the season changing. They were excited to find red, yellow, orange and purple leaves, berries and even mushrooms out on the field. They collected some leaves to bring back to the classroom and had lots of crafty fun with them.



A special visitor came to visit them this week too. Her name was Grace and she is a paramedic. She brought along some things to show the children including a heart rate monitor, stethoscope and her helmet. She told them about her job and Reception asked some interesting questions.



Year 1 Theme - making fossils

Year 1 theme - Our journey into the past - has continued and children have learned more about the amazing fossil hunter, Mary Anning. The children had a wonderfully messy, but very fun, lesson creating their very own fossils out of salt dough!





Year 2 Maths and History

Year 2 have looked at using clues to find ways to estimate on a number line. They also did a draw along of Victoria and Albert – aren't they're brill!





Year 5 Science

Science was a real highlight this week. The children became scientists, designing parachutes to test air resistance. We timed each fall, compared results and discussed why the bigger parachutes floated down more slowly. Lots of excitement, brilliant teamwork and great scientific thinking

Items from previous updates:

Applications for Year 7

Current Year 6 children can now apply for a secondary school place.

For those living in Birmingham this should be done via the local authority admissions website:

https://www.birmingham.gov.uk/info/20119/school admissions/1778/appl y for a secondary school year 7 place

You can list up to **six different secondary schools** as preferences in your application. This can include schools outside of Birmingham.

Make sure you list at least one local school where your child would have met the admissions criteria in previous years

If you don't do this, you might end up with a place offered which is none of your options and will be the most local school with places available; this could be several miles away!

Birmingham City Council runs a co-ordinated admissions scheme with neighbouring local authorities.

If you are applying for schools in another local authority then we recommend that you contact them for their admissions arrangements as this will help you to decide if your application is likely to be successful.

Birmingham City Council will only deal with applications for school places if you live in Birmingham and pay council tax to the authority.

Local secondary schools often have open evenings for prospective children and parents.

Here are the local schools which we strongly advice are included as at least one of your 6 options.



School Policy Reminders

Label clothing and equipment

Please label children's clothing – especially jumpers, coats and lunchboxes. Items with names on get back to their owners much faster!

Start times and pick up times

Start times:

The playground gates open at 8.30am. All pupils should be in class by 8.40pm.

The top gates are closed promptly at 8.40am.

Arrivals after this time should walk around to the school office via the vehicle entrance.

Pick up times:

3.20pm (Monday to Thursday)

12.40 (Friday)

Reception doors open 5 minutes before these times to allow parents to collect reception children before collecting other children.

We ask that parents collect children from Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 BEFORE collecting siblings from Year 1 and 2; this helps us clear the playground at the end of the day.

Nuts:

Children should not bring any items containing nuts into school.

Water Bottles:

Please ensure you child has a fresh water bottle each day. It is important for their health and learning that they stay hydrated.

Healthy snack:

Please remember to send only healthy snacks for your child to enjoy during the school day. Thank you for supporting our commitment to healthy eating.

Birthday Treats:

We ask that birthday treats are not bought into school; this includes food items and gift bags.

Jewellery:

The only jewellery allowed in schools is studded earrings and watches (No devices with any recording function); **All jewellery MUST be removed for PE and swimming**; we suggest jewellery is left at home on PE and Swimming days.


